### Healthcare reimagined

Theme Summary: Beyond the headline-grabbing controversies, a long journey lies ahead, as we navigate the complexities of our history, ideology and reality.

Healthcare is fast evolving in response to demands for better delivery of health outcomes; universal health coverage; improved coordination of care and the growing need for alignment between the private and public sectors. Other factors to consider include unemployment; fierce competition; emerging technologies; cost-containment; access and better quality of care. Succeeding in this tumultuous environment requires significant changes in the healthcare ecosystem, fundamentally altering the role, structure and relevance of all players in the industry. One trend that is facilitating the rapid transformation of the industry is convergence, which has facilitated the re-imagining of our system, accelerating multisectoral stakeholder collaboration outside their individual four walls, and redefined industry boundaries by converging business models and leveraging advanced technologies to create more value for the *health citizen*.

We are excited to announce the theme for this year's conference 'Convergence 2030 – healthcare reimagined'. The conference will reflect on the past 20 years, moving past the rhetoric and reimaging our desired end-state for 2030 and the role of convergence in defining what our future healthcare will look like. A huge part of the conference will be dedicated to understanding the role of multisectoral convergence in delivering quality health services and why it is important for scaling up. All stakeholders, payers, providers, patients, employers and the government are increasingly interconnected.
